Old Boy Paul Maynard MP

A second former St. Ambrose College student has been promoted by Theresa May, Paul Maynard earning his promotion from Under Secretary for Transport to the Whip's Office.

Paul attended St. Ambrose and went on to study at Oxford, achieving a first class honours degree, which he attributes to "the careful teaching at Ambrose."

He added: "I contested Twickenham in 2005 against Vince Cable before being selected a year later for Blackpool North and Cleveleys in 2006, winning it from Labour in 2010 and increasing my majority to 3,340 in 2015 and winning again last year."

Paul, who also manages the medical condition cerebral palsy, only the second MP with the condition, said: "After a few years as a Parliamentary Private Secretary to Oliver Letwin followed later by Amber Rudd, I was appointed Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State at the Department of Transport, responsible for light rail and trams. My new role is a wonderful challenge at a key time for the Government."

Paul, who went to St. Ambrose from 1986 to 1993, said: "St Ambrose for me, will always be a place that gave me opportunity, and encouraged me to aim high. It was never less than stimulating, and my memories will always be fond ones, not least of the staff."

St Ambrose College's Principal Mr Keulemans said: "To have one government minister is wonderful, to have two is quite incredible and both Paul and Damian are moving rapidly up the ranks.

"We always follow with the greatest interest the careers of our Old Boys. Damian and Paul were outstanding students of the College and are an inspiration to today's young Ambrosians. We congratulate them on their promotions and wish them every success in the future."

Last week Damian Hinds, who also attended St. Ambrose, was promoted to Education Secretary.

Cookery masterclass with Mr Singh

The ancient arts of traditional Indian cookery were revealed by Mr Singh, to his colleagues, during an after school staff enrichment project. A fourth generation British Indian, Mr Singh and his family have retained the traditions of their home city Amritsar, in the Punjab, and treat food as a daily celebration rather than a necessity. "We all eat together children, parents, grandparents and share our food, whether at home or at the Temple, and the art of spicing is learned from an early age," said the Maths teacher. Samantha Alford said: "It brings the team together and it is a lot of fun. Mr Singh added: "My favourite dish is a Shish kebab with Tandoori chicken cooked in a clay oven, but that's not really for beginners." During the evening he showed colleagues how to make quick and easy samosas and pakoras, balancing the spices to produce some tasty, nutritious and exciting Indian dishes. It certainly worked for the Head of Maths Mr Chapman, whose signature dish is, "beans on toast," who quickly added "I can't wait to show my wife some of my new tricks. I'm normally not allowed in the kitchen." Biology teacher, Miss Drogan, agreed: "I love slow cooking, putting on a chilli con carne in the morning and coming back from work to a lovely slow cooked meal, but Mr Singh's recipes were surprisingly easy and quick to prepare; the experience has certainly opened my eyes to a whole new cuisine." Mr Singh suggested the Indian cookery lesson in partnership with Cookery teacher Mrs Alford. They floated the idea with staff enrichment organisers Mrs Bull and Miss Drogan, adding to staff events which have also included sessions on mindfulness, a cycle ride and a staff book club.

Our first rugby fixture of the New Year saw a traditional block against King's School Macclesfield. Traditionally, King's are one of our toughest opponents and in 10 fixtures we are usually delighted to get as many wins as losses. The strength in depth this year resulted in 7 College teams recording victory, and in losses 1st, 2nd and U15 A ran their opponent to within 2 scores.

In contrast strong wins were achieved at U15B, U14A and B, U13A and B and U12 A and B where over 50 tries were scored by St Ambrose teams (an outstanding display of open attacking rugby to match). The College team of the week was very difficult to choose from some outstanding individual performances, but Rodney Rodriguez stole the show at U13 A team level, running in 5 tries in his sides victory. Harry Smithers on the opposite wing was said to be disappointed with his "meagre three scores"! I am not sure who went home with the match ball?

The College teams have been rewarded with similar success in County Competitions and are already County champions at U12; the U14 and U16 teams contesting County Cup finals on Thursday January 25th at Burnage rugby club. I hope many supporters will travel to Varley Park, Burnage to cheer both sides on. The U14 final kicks off at 11.45 am, the U16s at 2.30pm. We wish both sides well. A hat trick of successes would probably be the best any County schoolboy side has achieved, especially when you consider the strength of Cheshire schools.

Our Seniors are also one match away from a National Final, playing in the Nat West Vase semi final on the Wednesday 28th February at 2.15pm, at home, against Trinity School Croydon. With so much to play for it is good to see so many boys training. With 7s rugby still to begin, the season has the potential to end as one of our best in recent times, so this commitment is necessary if we are to fulfil the early potential shown this season.

Success in the pool last week was achieved with U15, 14, 13 and 12 sides, all winning their respective galas against Cheadle Hulme School. Similarly, all sides were victorious against Manchester G.S on Tuesday. Well done to the five teams involved. Additionally the Senior and U15 water polo teams both won their respective league games and now progress to National finals. College water polo clubs and Junior trampolining Clubs are again attracting good numbers and we hope similar enthusiasm will be shown when Indoor cricket nets begin after Half term. Our 1st years are competing in the GM Schools Indoor athletics championships on Feb 2nd and Rowers will shortly be involved as Trafford's representatives in 4 age groups in North West finals.

Senior footballers were unlucky in losing a close game, 2-3, to King's Chester. They did avenge this with a 6-0 victory on Wednesday against Wellington School in the Trafford League Fixture.

Basketball sides did not enjoy the best of weeks. Our U16 side lost to Altrincham G.S and our Under 14s similarly failed to break down a zone defence operated by a strong Sale High School.

In House Championships, the Cross Country races were completed with some fine individual successes. Thomas Jackson was crowned 4th year winner; Luis Rojo, 3rd year; James Kelly 2nd year and Henry Ashby 1st year were also winners. Over 100 runners competed in each race. The House Championships have now been completed in Rugby and Football along with Basketball, Badminton, Table-Tennis, Rowing, Water Polo and Swimming.
