Key words	Absolution: A declaration by a priest during the Sacrament of Reconciliation that a person's sins have been forgiven. Confession: To speak your sins out loud to a priest in order to receive absolution. Conscience: The name we give to human reason when it makes moral decisions to do what is right and to avoid what is evil. Contrition: Being sorry for one's sins. Penance: An action which demonstrates sorrow for sin Reconciliation: (1) The restoration of a relationship which has been damaged. (2) Sacrament of Reconciliation gives forgiveness of sins/ strength to resist temptation.
