Grammaire

Subject, reflexive, direct object and indirect object pronouns are all linked to the verb of a sentence.

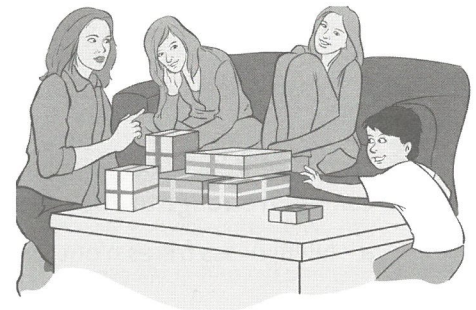
Object pronouns precede the verb (*Je t'envoie un mail*) except in the imperative (*Envoie-lui un mail*).

Emphatic or disjunctive pronouns (more on page 42) are used after prepositions (*avec eux, pour moi*).

When more than one pronoun is used after the subject pronoun (*Je le lui donnerai*), you have to place the pronouns in the correct order – see Exercise 3 below.
