#### A Message from the Principal

Firstly, I am sorry that I didn't manage to include a weekly message in last week's edition of the newsletter. You will be aware that we were holding our entrance examination and as a result, we had a very different day and I didn't quite get the chance to write as I normally would.



It isn't often that I focus on our governors in the newsletter but it would be remiss of me not to mention yesterday's NGA awards for outstanding governance held at the Houses of Parliament. Our governing board were a finalist in the single school category and was awarded third place from almost 60 entrants from across the country. The role of a governor requires an incredible level of service and commitment and I would like to thank them and indeed congratulate them on behalf of the whole community on their magnificent achievement yesterday.

On Tuesday we celebrated the outstanding GCSE results of our current year 12 students. In our summer press release, we mentioned that their achievements were record-breaking and in the recent information evenings, I highlighted some of the key headlines. The results are now available on our website with the Attainment 8 score sitting at 72.79 and the Progress 8 score coming in at +1.00. Those figures mean that the average grade of our students was almost a third of a grade higher than an 'A' grade in 'old money' (based on their best 8 results) and that on average, each student attained 1 grade higher than what was expected based on their key stage 2 prior attainment. The Progress 8 score is comfortably the highest in the school's history with almost all key measures in line with or higher than the 2022 outcomes which, of course, were inflated nationally. Congratulations to all prize winners particularly those who were given additional prizes in specific categories. It was lovely to spend time with the students, parents and carers recognising that the outcomes didn't come about by chance and were the result of dedication and hard work over many months and indeed years.

As the year progresses, it is necessary to remind parents of the importance of the apps which we use to communicate key information to you. #### **Sports Training Timetable**

All students are encouraged to take part in at least one physical activity and we have tried to offer as wide a choice of Winter Sports as possible, House competitions will also be starting very soon in their Games lessons. The water polo lessons after school are a paid for activity and will start when numbers are confirmed. All other practices begin in the week commencing Monday 11th September. We have lunchtime practices to ensure all students have an equal opportunity to compete for School team selection. The exception is in Senior football where boys are asked to stay until 5pm for their practices and year 10/11 basketball (although basketball will be an option in the year 10&11 games lessons) Boys can wear appropriate non-school kit for practices to enable parents time to wash Games and PE kit which should be worn in curricular lessons. Any boys unable to take part in those lessons should bring a note or alternatively join teachers in the swimming pool or Fitness suite where an appropriate activity will be given to assist their injury. Please make sure your son has the appropriate kit for all lessons.

To our returning students, welcome back and to our new students, we are so happy to have you here. Many students at the school know who I am and will point you in my direction should you need any help or support with anything. This is my seventh year here so I hope that most of the time I can answer any questions you might have, but if I can't, I am sure I can point you in the direction of someone who can.

My role is Pastoral/ Welfare Manager and I am available to support you every day during your time here. Alongside this job role, I am also the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead so if you have any safeguarding concerns please do feel free to come and speak to me.

Day to day, you can find me in the "Pastoral Hub" office which is located on the ground floor opposite the languages department. It is the one with the frosted windows and also houses Mrs Keary (our SENDCO) and Mr Murray (School Chaplain).

A lot of my role at the school is supporting students who are finding it difficult to settle, have issues with their mental health, problems at home or are experiencing issues with their friendship groups. I coordinate the school counsellors, who work in school on a Monday and a Thursday. If you feel you would benefit from talking to a counsellor please do let me know, and I can arrange this for you as it is by appoint-



ment only. We often do have a waiting list but most of the time it is much shorter than trying to arrange external counselling. Sometimes, I will need to speak to you about your behaviour choices but I am hopeful that I won't need to do this too often.

One of the best parts of my job is that I am pretty much always available to you as I don't have a teaching timetable. I really enjoy getting to know you so please always feel like you can stop me to have a conversation and tell me a bit about yourself. I am involved with the Y7 rugby teams this year so many of you will see me on Saturday mornings too.


I hope you all enjoy this year and that you are able to make the most of the excellent opportunity you have by attending this great school.

by cancer in one way of another so it is important that we keep funding the research to help find a cure.






## **SCHOOL NEWS**


