We have been undertaking a travel survey in response to some of the issues being experienced on some buses and routes this year. It is crucial that all students, sixth form included, complete this survey so that we can ascertain how we can best work with TfGM to resolve the issues.

Our new library system has been launched and will initially start with year 7 pupils accessing it on a Tuesday lunchtime. This is a new initiative for us this year and will gradually be rolled out throughout key stage 3. We have been fortunate in that the generosity of parents and SAPA have enabled us to provide a bank of new books across a range of genres.

Another new initiative for this academic year is the Sixth Form lecture series taking place on Wednesday afternoons. This coming Wednesday we welcome Mr Andrew Higginson, chairman of JD Sports. Mr Higginson will be addressing the gentlemen of the Sixth Form on leadership and character. Mr Higginson is also well known for his work in launching TESCO bank and we are in no doubt that he will inspire our students to realise that there is no ceiling for ambition and potential success. The following week we will have a talk from Frederick Naftal about the Holocaust discussing the personal and global impact that this tragic period had on world history.

Our rugby teams had a mixed experience against Leeds Grammar last

weekend but our senior football team have progressed in the national cup yet again, this time overcoming Bolton School despite having played with ten men for most of the match. We wish all our teams every success again this weekend.

It seems a long time since the Rugby World Cup got underway, but we are now at the point where things get a little bit more interesting. In the background, the Cricket World Cup has gone under the radar with England receiving a bit of a pummelling by New Zealand in a repeat of the last 50-over World Cup final at Lord's back in 2019. It looks like England's cricketers have a slightly tougher group than their rugby union counterparts. At least both of those sports know how to make effective use of VAR/technology by having half-decent communication unlike the shambles at White Hart Lane last weekend. The whole point of VAR was to ensure that it was more likely to come to the correct decision. Therefore, how it can then be the case that the laws prevent a match from being brought back after a few seconds to rectify such a huge error is baffling. Stopping the game and getting to the right outcome would have been 'the lesser of two evils' but instead we've had to endure the week-long fallout. It seems that they are making the system more difficult than it ought to

Sports Training Timetable

All students are encouraged to take part in at least one physical activity and we have tried to offer as wide a choice of Winter Sports as possible, House competitions will also be starting very soon in their Games lessons. We have lunchtime practices to ensure all students have an equal opportunity to compete for School team selection. The exception is in Senior football where boys are asked to stay until 5pm for their practices and year 10/11 basketball (although basketball will be an option in the year 10&11 games lessons) Boys can wear appropriate non-school kit for practices to enable parents time to wash Games and PE kit which should be worn in curricular lessons. Any boys unable to take part in those lessons should bring a note or alternatively join teachers in the swimming pool or Fitness suite where an appropriate activity will be given to assist their injury. 
