A Message from the Principal

With the beginning of half-term approaching it seems appropriate to mention that term dates for 2024-25 have been published on local authority websites and unfortunately it looks as though there are differences across the various Greater Manchester boroughs again. Whilst we don't necessarily have to follow the Trafford dates, we do aim to work alongside local Catholic schools when confirming our dates so please don't book in any holidays just yet! My reason for raising this is due to my ongoing frustration that dates such as the upcoming half-term can't be coordinated at a wider level to benefit the many families, and indeed teachers, who have children or work across different local authorities. With so much focus on wellbeing and pupil attendance, it should be a priority area.

I'm going to get my moans out of the way early and then aim to finish positively. Earlier this week an article appeared in the Manchester Evening News regarding the views of some residents and councillors on our lettings. Firstly, the headline chosen by the journalist in question was incredibly unhelpful and it wasn't particularly clear that the alleged language concerned was NOT coming from students of St Ambrose College. Indeed, I am aware that the local clubs making use of the facilities aren't best pleased with the claims being attributed to their members. We were disappointed by many aspects of the article. Firstly, we know there was a recent floodlight issue which meant that, due to an electrical fault, the lights came on and remained on through the night. That is an isolated incident. We haven't been "blatantly flouting" the agreements as was claimed. We have engaged and responded positively when we have been made aware of an issue. Most recently, we reduced our planning application from 10 pm to 8 pm following constructive discussions with the local residents concerned. We don't feel the article was balanced but we are grateful for the many positive comments, both verbally and on social media about the school and our fantastic students. We are proud that local children and local clubs are availing of our facilities and we will continue to respond constructively to views expressed by residents. We were also disappointed to read the views of local Hale Barns councillors and we will aim to meet with them to ascertain the reasons behind the change in position and to obtain general clarity on this issue.

The Department of Education released the national GCSE results yesterday and we are currently ranked 87th for our attainment 8 score of 72.7 (will rise when finalised) and just outside the top 100 for Progress 8. Whilst we are delighted with our scores and outcomes, please don't be making snap judgements about schools across the North-west who are doing amazing things regardless of what their Progress 8 score is.

On to the positive content now! Yesterday we took six staff to the official launch of The Gaudete Trust at Edgbaston, Birmingham. It was such a positive, engaging day meeting dozens of staff from across the trust and most importantly taking away practical ideas and suggestions about making the trust high profile and visible across all the schools.



Year 7 pupils have all returned from the annual retreat to Castlerigg. As ever, the weather in The Lakes has been shocking throughout the retreat but the whole point of a retreat is to challenge. I hope all your sons have returned with positive experiences, comments and maybe even new friendships. As they are returning, the members of the Aquinas House from year 8 upwards are participating in their afternoon of rewards for winning the House Cup in the last academic year.

Visitors to the school this week have included a Careers Café focusing on architecture and a guest speaker on the Holocaust on Wednesday afternoon. Governors linked with the pastoral dimension to the school met with students on Monday to focus on welfare and in sport, we competed against Lymm High School in the Cheshire cup with victory for our year 11 team but defeat for our year 9 team. Thank you to all staff involved and to Mr Aspinwall for leading our cross-country teams last weekend.

Congratulations to all recipients of the Principal's Award at breaktime today. An opportunity to receive the award for another student could come in the form of being the successful designer of our school Christmas card. Please encourage your son(s) to see Mr Roderick for more information. We would love to see a variety of entries. Staying on the theme of Christmas, don't forget the SAPA Christmas Fair booked in for Saturday 2nd December and watch this space for details on a the bottle tombola!

UCAS early entry has been a focus over the past fortnight and we have had numerous students accessing the various tests. We wish them all well with their endeavours.

Finally, we are seeking to recruit a teacher of RE and a Second in PE/Sport for a January start. If you know of potential applicants please point them to the documents on our website and note the deadline of next Friday morning.

Sports Training Timetable

All students are encouraged to take part in at least one physical activity and we have tried to offer as wide a choice of Winter Sports as possible, House competitions will also be starting very soon in their Games lessons. The water polo lessons after school are a paid for activity and will start when numbers are confirmed. We have lunchtime practices to ensure all students have an equal opportunity to compete for School team selection. The exception is in Senior football where boys are asked to stay until 5pm for their practices and year 10/11 basketball (although basketball will be an option in the year 10&11 games lessons) Boys can wear appropriate non-school kit for practices to enable parents time to wash Games and PE kit which should be worn in curricular lessons. Any boys unable to take part in those lessons should bring a note or alternatively join teachers in the swimming pool or Fitness suite where an appropriate activity will be given to assist their injury. Please make sure your son has the appropriate kit for all lessons. A reminder - kit is as follows:

Games lessons: Hooped rugby shirt, rugby shorts, games socks, boots. (shin pads when on football)

PE lessons: white polo shirt or blue PE shirt, blue shorts, white socks, trainers. (for some outside sports your teacher may ask you to bring your games kit)

Swim lesson: house swim jammers, towel, hat, goggles.

SPORTS REPORT

CROSS COUNTRY—First round

Thursday 19th October saw the first round of the English School's Cross Country Cup take place at North Cestrian's playing fields just down the road in Altrincham. The first round puts schools in the Greater Manchester county against one another, to qualify for a place in the North West Final where they will join the top 3 schools from Cumbria, Merseyside and Lancashire.



The course was very flat, with a few boggy areas due to heavy rain the night before. The Junior boys race consists of years 7&8 running together, with the Intermediate boys years 9&10.

Our Junior team were first up and finished in a great second place, with 3 runners inside the top 10. Thomas D moved excellently through the field to finish in 2nd place individually, on his first time representing the school. This was even more impressive considering he is still year 7. The other members of the team were Shea G in 7th, Henry F in 10th, Zac F in 20th and Cormac K in 22nd. Henry and Cormac are both year 7 too which bodes well for their team in 12 months' time.

The Intermediate team dominated the race with 3 runners finishing inside the top 4. Thomas A narrowly beat Liam O in a sprint finish to take the individual victory. Gabriel M wasn't too far behind in 4th place. James S, Oliver H and Adam L, all year 9's, also ran well to place in 10th, 18th and 19th respectively to take an easy team win.

This meant that both teams qualified for the North West final, which will take place at Sedbergh School, Cumbria on Wednesday 8th November. Any team that finishes in the top 3 in that race, will make it to the National Final in Suffolk. That will be the goal for all 3 of our teams this year, with the Senior team of years 11-13 joining the other two.


