A Message from the Principal

We have begun the celebrations for Allhallowtide this week, allowing us to reflect on the lives of those who have gone before us. Although much of All Hallows Eve has been lost amongst consumerism, many thankfully retain customs such as, among others, lighting and leaving candles on the graves of the dead on this day. We were able to celebrate Mass on the feast of All Saints on Thursday as a reminder of the connection between the different parts of the Church and connecting with the theme of intercession of the saints both in our lives and in praying for the souls of the dead. We will continue to remember our dead throughout November including having a book of remembrance in our chapel.

Our Christmas Fair falls on Saturday 2nd December. It promises to be bigger than ever. In addition to a huge tombola stall, we also have stalls from external companies. There will be the usual music, prizes and food available so we look forward to welcoming you then. We will hold our first non-uniform day in quite a few years later in the month with the agreement that a donation of a bottle to our tombola is received.

This morning we reminded year 13 students about OFQUAL guidance on plagiarism, not for any specific reason in terms of events in school, but more to do with the prevalence of Al. In many ways this isn't a new issue given the accessibility of the internet but it's a slightly different angle. Given some of Elon Musk's comments last night in a talk in the presence of the Prime Minister, it is likely that things will evolve in education as a result of Al so watch this space.

We continue to remember Liam O'Connor in our prayers, not only because we enter the month of November, but also because his friends continue to do amazing things in raising money for the charity BRAKE. Sam May recently completed the Manchester half marathon in under 2 hours, raising significant funds and remembering Liam in the process. Well done, Sam and thank you.

We look forward to welcoming year 11 parents and carers to our 6th Form information evening this coming Wednesday. There will be opportunities to visit five departments and hear subject-specific presentations. Another date for the diary for year 11 parents and carers is the parents' evening the following week. We received a lovely correspondence from a member of the public this morning, stating that 2 of our students had helped him and assist with moving his car following a breakdown on Hale Road this morning. 

Sports Training Timetable

All students are encouraged to take part in at least one physical activity and we have tried to offer as wide a choice of Winter Sports as possible, House competitions will also be starting very soon in their Games lessons. The water polo lessons after school are a paid for activity and will start when numbers are confirmed. We have lunchtime practices to ensure all students have an equal opportunity to compete for School team selection. The exception is in Senior football where boys are asked to stay until 5pm for their practices and year 10/11 basketball (although basketball will be an option in the year 10&11 games lessons) Boys can wear appropriate non-school kit for practices to enable parents time to wash Games and PE kit which should be worn in curricular lessons. Any boys unable to take part in those lessons should bring a note or alternatively join teachers in the swimming pool or Fitness suite where an appropriate activity will be given to assist their injury. Please make sure your son has the appropriate kit for all lessons. A reminder - kit is as follows:

Games lessons: Hooped rugby shirt, rugby shorts, games socks, boots. (shin pads when on football)

PE lessons: white polo shirt or blue PE shirt, blue shorts, white socks , trainers. (for some outside sports your teacher may ask you to bring your games kit)

Swim lesson: house swim jammers, towel, hat, goggles.

Therefore, this year's school show aims to be part of a bigger advocacy project to raise awareness towards the plight of refugees and asylum seekers. It will be an original performance, created by everyone who wants to be involved.

So far there has been a weekly drama club (Thurs 1pm, everyone welcome) for performance ideas to be shared and tested out using fun drama techniques and games.

As we move forward we aim to use words from people we interview in the performance and we are also planning to work with a Manchester based Theatre company, Box of Tricks who are interested in leading workshops for students on devising, scripting and movement. Anyone who would like to take part should come along to our next rehearsal Thursday 1pm in 2310 (the Drama studio), students do not have to be studying Drama to participate. 4 Where it says 'How many would you like to buy' if you add in '1' (cost £5) that means you will get 5 separate tickets (1 book of 5) if you add in '2' (cost £10) that means you will get 10 separate tickets (2 books of 5) and so on.

Tickets are £5 for 5 single tickets.

You will get 5x single raffle tickets, all 5 go into the draw separately for 5x chances to win! Tickets are only sold in a book of 5.

Please note: You will NOT receive a physical ticket! But please be assured that if you have made your payment then your ticket purchase will be registered with us.

Here is what happens after you have selected and paid for your ticket: The SAPA committee take the list of all the names of people who have bought tickets from the ParentPay system, we then physically write your name and number onto paper tickets, these will then be mixed up with all the tickets sold on the day of the Christmas Fair where everything is given a good shake and the live draw is then made.
