A Message from the Principal

Today is the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Although we celebrated our weekly Mass with a focus on the feast of St Ambrose yesterday, we also included a post-Communion reflection on today's feast. Although Mary was conceived without sin, we weren't and therefore we have two opportunities for individual confessions with our local priests next week, alongside the Advent reconciliation services. Please encourage your son to let his form tutor know if he wishes to attend individual confession. Going back to the feast day of St Ambrose, we are grateful to Fr Tom for celebrating both Masses with us and for his homily which reminded all of us about the story, traits and skills of Ambrose of Milan. What I took from the homily was that Ambrose wasn't actually a theologian, having more of a background in law. The people of Milan wanted him to be Bishop despite the gaps in theology. They did so because he was seen to be fair minded, charitable and just. It was those qualities that they deemed important for their leader, particularly at a time of division.

On Tuesday afternoon there was heartbreak for the rugby U18 first XV as they exited the Natwest Vase at the quarter-final stage as a result of a last kick of the game penalty. We are proud of their efforts and for coming so close to another national semi-final for the school. The opportunity for silverware isn't over with yet however, as there is a Cheshire Cup final against King's, Macclesfield on the horizon. The same team lost at the same stage in the U16 version two years ago so there remains an opportunity to finish the season, and indeed their 15 a-side rugby at St Ambrose on a high. Tomorrow's fixtures are against Manchester Grammar School.

Tuesday also saw the Winter Concert take place in the central atrium. It was a wonderfully festive occasion and we have had some very positive parental feedback since. There was a lovely balance of secular and traditional Christmas music and it's always uplifting to listen to a full orchestra and choir. Thank you to Miss Yates, Mr Vaughton and all who helped, as well as our SAPA volunteers for organising the raffle.

Staying with SAPA, last weekend's Christmas Fair was very well attended and we managed to raise more than £7,500. We cannot thank you all enough for your contributions whether via donations or buying raffle tickets. There is a long list of prize winners in the central atrium. Seeing the number of local businesses who donated prizes reminded me to give a nudge to support local where possible in the days and weeks ahead. It tends to be the independent companies who donate most prizes so please bear that in mind when considering your shopping options in the run up to Christmas. It is a crucial period for independent and small businesses.

Our football teams have had mixed results this week with the U16A team beating St Matthew's to progress to round 6 of the ESFA national cup but the B team went down to a last-minute winner away at Tytherington yesterday. In the pool, we hosted the Trafford swimming gala on Wednesday and our year 7 and year 9 teams were crowned Trafford champions. There were excellent performances from all teams. In the national cross-country tournament in Suffolk last weekend the teams came 16th with particular individual

acknowledgement for Liam O who finished 12th overall. We have just heard that the north-west regional final of the schools water polo has concluded at Bolton School with the U18 team finishing 3rd, meaning they have progressed into the Plate regional qualifiers.

Despite the freezing temperatures last weekend, students from year 7 through to year 13 braved the elements to raise awareness of homelessness. Thank you to



all the boys and to the staff who certainly led by example. Particular thanks to Dr Rousseau for organising and to Cormac McArt from the Westcourt Centre in Belfast who came across specifically for the event. Cormac and Mr Murray delivered a presentation as part of the evening.

Year 7 and 8 were treated to a visit from renowned author Aisling Fowler, who led an inspirational talk and signed copies of her latest book. See inside for more details.

This Sunday is the Carols by Candlelight service at Holy Angels and we will be represented by Chris and Oliver in year 12. Thank you to both students. For those wanting more festive carols, you are all more than welcome to our annual carol service, which will also take place at Holy Angels on Tuesday 19th December at 6pm. Our musicians have been busy of late. In addition to the Christmas Fair and winter concert mentioned above, they played a key role in contributing to a fantastic atmosphere in the annual St Vincent de Paul Christmas party on Wednesday afternoon. We had dozens of our local VIPs in attendance with the 6th Form students again displaying maturity and leadership, not only in their preparations but in their general and genuine compassion for our visitors.

We are having particular success with our Oxbridge applications this year. We have had more than a dozen interviews take place in the past fortnight and there are more to come. Thank you to all parents and old boys who have supported the students through this process as well as staff at Loreto who we have been collaborating with.

Finally, today sees the release of the long-awaited Wonka film. The film tells the back story of Willy Wonka, the central character in Roald Dahl's classic Charlie and the Chocolate Factory novel but it is an original adaptation. It isn't just fans of Dahl who will be excited as the music features original songs by Neil Hannon (of The Divine Comedy) & a score written by Joby Talbot (previously of The Divine Comedy). There might be very slight Derry bias but I believe Hannon to be the best Irish songwriter of all time and am delighted that he has seemingly managed to receive his 'big break' with his involvement in the film. There might even be an Academy Award or Grammy around the corner.


FEAST OF ST AMBROSE

On Thursday 7th December the College held a celebratory Mass to mark the St Ambrose Feast Day. This whole school event was held in the Central Atrium.




Winter Concert



SPORTS REPORT

CROSS COUNTRY FINAL

Saturday 2nd December saw the Intermediate and Senior boys cross country teams compete in the Cross Country Cup National Final, in Woodbridge School, Suffolk. Just being in the final meant that the teams were already in the top 27 in the country, but everyone involved wanted to try and get an elusive top 10 finish after the seniors placed 13th in 2022 with a young team.

The journey down to Ipswich on Friday afternoon was longer than expected, with a main road closure making an already long journey last an extra hour and a half longer than it could have been. But we arrived in time for some of the boys to have a short shake-out run, before heading into the city centre for a group pre-race carb loading meal.

The day of the race was bitterly cold, and after arriving at Woodbridge School, walking the course and seeing how firm the ground was, the boys knew they were in for a fast race against some of the best young athletes in the country. The Intermediate boys were up first for us running 4.3km and Liam O had one of the best races of his life to finish in a very impressive 12th place individually. Only 16 seconds behind was Thomas A in 26th. Gabriel Mc had a great start to the race but started to fade in the last 600m, he should still be happy with a 69th place finish though. The fourth counter for the team was James S in 115th place, followed by Adam L in 139th. This all meant as a team, they finished in 16th place which is still one of our best finishes in the competition.







The Senior boys race started extremely fast and a lot of the team are used to starting steady and progressing through the field. With the quality of the opposition it is very hard to gain places and get into the top 50 when everyone is running so fast. Gabor P was our first counter in 80th place, then the next three team counters were all very close with Joseph D, James O and Ben H coming home in 90th,92nd and 94th respectively. Despite coming so close, they all ran very different races, with Ben making his way back from second last after the first 200m! Andras P found the race tough after a lack of running training due to a long layoff earlier in the year, he finished in 120th. Benedict K was also struggling with a knee injury and placed 151st. The Senior boys team finished in 22nd place, which on the day was disappointing for the boys hoping for higher, but they still have to remember that they are the 22nd best team in the country.

Next year, the boys will hopefully be closer to the top 10 as the year 10's will come into the senior team to add strength in depth.




AUTHOR VISIT

CORMAC H—STUDENT SPONSORSHIP

Suicide is the biggest killer of young people under the age of 35 in the UK, every year over 1800 young people took their own lives. PAPYRUS is a national charity who provides confidential support and advice to young people struggling with thoughts of suicide, and anyone worried about a young person through their helpline, HOPELINE247.

Cormac wants to raise awareness to help all young people who deal with suicidal thoughts and will be running a 5k every day for the 25 days up to Christmas to raise money for PAPYRUS. Cormac has created a Strava Challenge dedicated to this and encourage everyone to give it their best shot.

He says, "I think that young people have many stressful problems that they are very good at hiding to the naked eye, and especially with the need to have a perfect social media nowadays, it's even more of a problem that needs to be stopped.

I think that running is a great form of escapism, regardless of pace. It can be a place where you can clear your head, appreciate nature or the community, listen to your favourite music or even just get out of the house and feel accomplished about yourself. For me, it gives me purpose to my day and if I can raise money for a charity by doing it that's amazing. "


















General Notices
