### A Message from the Principal

This Sunday is the third week of Advent and it is the Sunday where we light the rose candle, representing joy. Therefore, it is also referred to as Gaudete Sunday which seems an appropriate time to inform parents and carers about what it means for St Ambrose College to be part of the recently established Gaudete Trust.

The word Gaudete means 'joyful', and the Trust is a family of 17 schools from 5 collaborating Religious Orders. Although most schools are based in the north-west, the schools are spread as far as London and Southampton. To be clear, this isn't what is commonly referred to as a multi-academy trust (MAT) with a CEO etc. The Gaudete Trust is a new, collaborative way for schools founded by religious congregations (in our case, the Christian Brothers) to come under one trusteeship at a time when there are fewer brothers to take on the position of trustees. The charisms of the schools share much in common and the composition will allow us to 'rejoice' (Gaudete) in the rich heritage of Religious Orders education and in our young people. There will be short assemblies for each year group to inform them of this new Trust next week, again tying in with Gaudete Sunday. Apart from a change in trusteeship (the Christian Brothers are still represented), the key difference for us is that we will have opportunities to work with a new and wide family of schools and many initial ideas were discussed at the launch event in Edgbaston, Birmingham, a couple of months ago.



I was asked about the reasons behind the rose candle and in following up, picked up some new knowledge. I knew about the lighter shade representing a break from the darkness in the middle of Advent but I'd never heard of the candle being referred to as The Shepherds candle before. It gets the name as it reminds of the joy experienced by the shepherd's as they found the new born Jesus.

In school, we've been celebrating Advent and subsequently preparing for Christmas by having reconciliation services and individual confession this week. Many thanks to Fr Tom and Fr Jonathan but also thanks to Fr John for leading our celebration of Mass yesterday. Different year groups have different Advent appeals which conclude next week so please remember to send in donations with your son(s) next week.

I met with members of our community who aren't of the Catholic faith at lunchtime on Wednesday. This followed on from some ideas raised during the recent inter-faith week. Wednesday's discussion was really enjoyable and thought-provoking. Whilst all the students clearly enjoy being students of St Ambrose College, it was also clear

that there is more we can do to ensure that we are inclusive. I look forward to seeing some of the actions coming to fruition.



Although there were many nominations for the Principal's Award this morning, only 5 students turned up for their hot chocolate, badge, certificate and selection box. Given that the funeral of Brother Ignatius took place in Bowdon yesterday, it was fitting however that all 5 recipients were members of Ignatius House. During the distribution of hot chocolates, there was some controversy with the pronunciation of the word marshmallow. I stand firm in my view that it is pronounced as it's spelt and there is no 'e' sound at any point. I am aware that a current music artist isn't helping matters.

In Saturday's rugby fixtures there was a clean sweep against Manchester Grammar School (MGS) and our basketball teams had mixed results against Altrincham Grammar School for Boys on Wednesday, with the under-16 fixture particularly close fought. Our water polo teams have just returned home after winning 5-3 on penalties against MGS to reach the next round of the national competition, and our senior cross-country team have been crowned Trafford champions. Congratulations to everyone involved across all sports. Please note that there are no rugby fixtures tomorrow.

I probably don't congratulate staff enough in my weekly message but I would like to acknowledge Mrs Hill, Mr Cook, Mr McFadden and Mr Fitzsimon who all achieved their NPQSL awards this week.

I look forward to seeing many of you at the Carol Service at Holy Angels on Tuesday. Please note the 7pm start time which is a shift from 6pm in previous years. In the meantime, have a wonderful, joyful weekend!

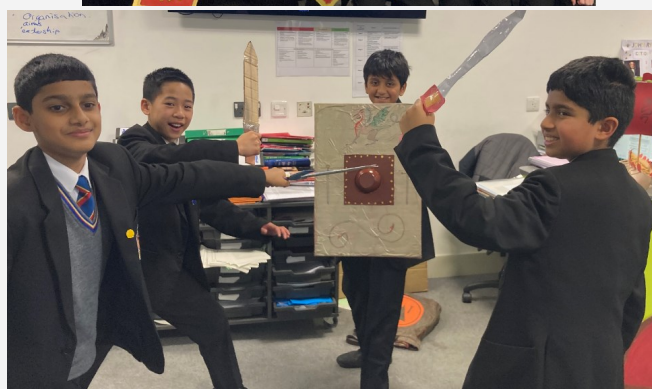

## YEAR 7—HISTORY PROJECT: Britain Before 1066

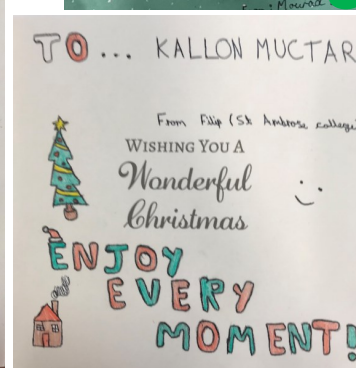
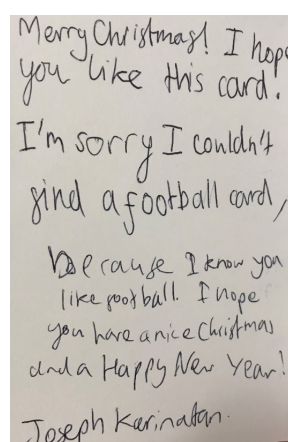
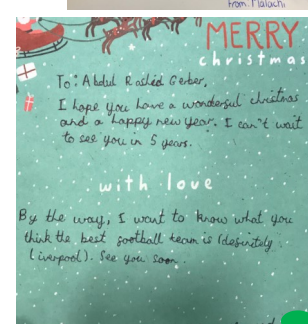
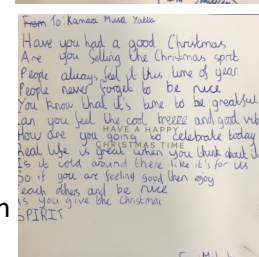

# SPORTS REPORT

## TRAFFORD SCHOOL'S CROSS COUNTRY

Crossford Bridge, Sale was once again was the location for the Trafford Schools' Cross Country race. It is a chance for all boys to start their journey to compete for the county in the English Schools Cross Country Championships next year. In order to do so, they would need to place in the top 8 in Trafford, then the top 8 in the Greater Manchester Championships at Heaton Park in early February. In total, St Ambrose had 11 boys across all age groups given letters for them to compete for Trafford in 2024. The day was about individual successes rather than the team scores for once as different year groups were missing key members due to illnesses and other commitments.

The year 7 boys race saw Thomas D take an impressive win, leading from the start and despite being chased all the way, pulled away from a challenger in the later stages. In contrast, Henry F started very slowly and was trapped in the pack at the start of the race, but overtook the vast majority of the field to finish in 4<sup>th</sup> place to complete a great run. Eben Y was a last minute recruit and ran better than his first John Leigh race to finish in 37<sup>th</sup>, Will J completed the team coming home in 55<sup>th</sup> to add to his tally of times representing the school.

The year 8-9 boys race saw James S and Adam L start quickly which has gone against their previous races this year. They reaped the rewards having their best race of the year to place in 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> respectively, both qualifying for the county championships. This was Adam's first year racing cross country so it is a great way to round off the year for him. Shea G was another late recruit in order to help the team out and he had a good race against the year above to finish in 20<sup>th</sup> place.

The year 10-11 boys race was very close for the team prize with just 2 points difference in the team totals. Sadly we just missed out to a very strong Stretford Grammar School team. This was despite Thomas A and Liam O'B finishing in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place respectively. Gabriel McG also placed in the top 8 which would normally be good enough to take the team prize, but with some of the year 11s competing mocks we were missing some of our stronger runners who would be up at the front of the race. Andrew K put on the Ambrose vest for the first time after running parkrun normally at the weekends, Isaac T also came to cross country trainings to improve his parkrun time and is now at a club. They show that you can take up running at any time during your life at school. They finished in 20<sup>th</sup> and 25 respectively.

The Senior boys race is always a small field, but perhaps never as small as it was on Tuesday. Ambrose were the only boys team in the race, meaning progression to the next round was guaranteed so long as the boys running finished...or started! Three of the team almost missed the start by doing a longer warm up and then being slow to put their spikes on! Thankfully, they just made it in time and used the race as a training run with some faster efforts after it. A necessary evil in order to gain entry for the county round for those hoping to run in the English Schools' finals. Gabor P, Andras P, Joe D and Ben H will all be hoping to be fit for the chance at doing just that at Heaton Park on the 3<sup>rd</sup> February.

Suicide is the biggest killer of young people under the age of 35 in the UK, every year over 1800 young people took their own lives. PAPYRUS is a national charity who provides confidential support and advice to young people struggling with thoughts of suicide, and anyone worried about a young person through their helpline, HOPELINE247.

For me, it gives me purpose to my day and if I can raise money for a charity by doing it that’s amazing. “

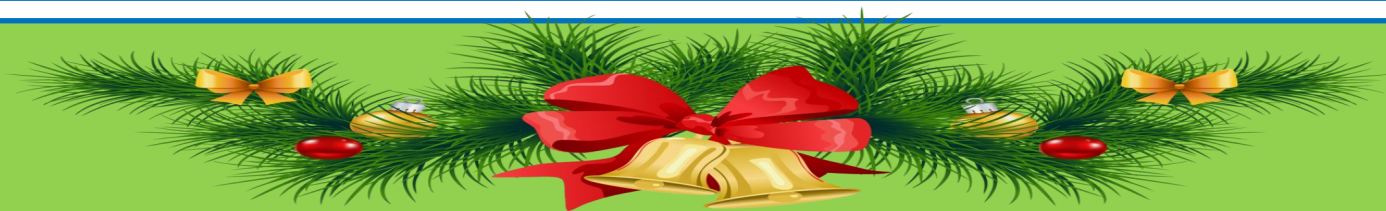
