A Message from the Principal

Apologies For the delayed newsletter from last week. Unfortunately, we had a network issue for a few hours on Friday. I have made tweaks to the original message so it doesn't come across as being too out of date. I had written about the beginning of the Six Nations and maybe not expecting too much against the French in Marseille but what do I know?

Some of the key foci for this week include Children's Mental Health Week and Safer Internet Day. For the latter, I am aware that resources have been shared with parents and carers and I would implore you to spend time digesting these materials. I can empathise with just how difficult it can be as a parent to navigate the everchanging landscape of online safety. Around the time of drafting the original message last Friday, news was breaking of the outcome of the tragic Brianna Ghey case and since then, her Mum, Esther, has suggested a change in the laws to prevent children under 16 from accessing social media. In one sense, the 'horse has already bolted' but we have a duty to do what we can to support our children in this area and being as knowledgeable as we can be as parents is crucial. To aid this, there will be dedicated evenings set aside for parents and carers later in the year.

We also have the Oxford Union debate being held at MGS this week as well as mini-DASH held at Chester Catholic High School, a guest speaker for 6th Form focusing on North Korea, Young Enterprise Trade Fair at Trafford Park, a Year 12 maths workshop at Bletchley Park and a chemistry competition held at Cambridge University. With the year 13 internal exams now concluded, the Year 13 students will enjoy a 'breather' with an afternoon at Total Ninja on Wednesday. Good luck to all involved and thank you to all the staff organising and accompanying the many trips and visits. Another highlight of the week ahead will be the auditions for the musical Joseph.

The weekend just gone saw many enrichment activities taking place including the Model UN Conference at Manchester High School for Girls where the team, ranging across several year groups, gave a great account of themselves. Similarly, our representatives in the Catenian public speaking competition did the school proud. Well done to Josh C and Teni O. The weekend's rugby fixtures versus Haberdashers' Adams saw 4 wins from 5 games.

In other sports fixtures last week, one of the highlights was the U16 first XI 4-2 victory against St James' in the national last 32 of the ESFA cup. We are now one of only a handful of northern teams left in the draw. The 6th Form first XI also enjoyed a fantastic victory against Bolton School. Last Friday saw our water-polo team U18 triumph in the national plate semi-finals in Northampton and their U15

counterparts will hope to achieve the same outcome when they travel to the same venue this coming Thursday. The U15 rugby first XV also head south to Stowe School in Buckinghamshire this week in their quest to reach the national semi-finals. Our basketball teams all enjoyed convincing wins with some maintaining 100% records and in athletics, the school finished 8th nationally, up 1 place from 2023 but in a



much larger field (of entries – to the best of my knowledge, the dimensions of the athletics field were unchanged).

The match at Stowe will be Mr Howarth's last game in charge of one of our rugby teams having given over 12 years of incredible commitment and service to the school on and off the field. I know many parents and carers will want to be in touch to wish Mr Howarth well before he begins an exciting next stage of his journey as he takes up his new role in Chile after the half-term. We look forward to welcoming Mr Stephen Depledge as his replacement. Mr Depledge joins us from Birkdale School in Sheffield and brings a wealth of experience and leadership.

We recently had a visit from Sandy Fairley, youth coordinator with the Diocese, to launch the Lourdes pilgrimage to our Sixth Form students. From experience, I couldn't recommend the opportunity enough so if your son is interested, please encourage him to speak to Mr Murray, Miss McCrory or me to find out more.

Finally, the undoubted highlight for me from last week was the hymn practice for Years 10 through to Year 13. They made an incredible sound and a number of staff were really moved by it.

Wednesday 31st January saw two teams of 6 runners take part in the 52nd King Henry VIII School National relay race at War Memorial Park, Coventry and is a much loved and highly regarded annual event. The race is the favourite of the year for many of our boys competing! It is unique in that there are no age groups, just the best 6 runners in your school compete together, so boys from upper 6th will be racing against promising year 7s! Our strong runners that competed lower down the school, are now at an age where they can hold their own in a race that has some of the best runners in the country (past and present,) competing on a course that has been the same for over 30 years.



After walking the course, it was clear the wooded section would be a lot slower than recent years due to added mud and puddles! With the addition of the strong winds on the day too, fast times were not anticipated. Last years best ever finish of 9th looked a tough ask to match or better.

The A Team of Liam O, Thomas A, James O, Andras P, Ben H and Joseph D all ran very well and there were some PB's despite the conditions. This enabled the team to finish in 8th place which is the highest ever finish for an Ambrose team.

The B team also had a really good performance, matching the highest overall position achieved by last year's runners of 30th, and placing 4th out of the 16 B teams competing. These runners were Gabriel M, Rory G, Dylan M, Ollie H, Tom D and Adam L.

pupils to know the importance of fostering a safe and responsible online environment, we aim to equip our students with the knowledge and skills to navigate the internet securely.




