A Message from the Principal

Many of you will already know that Mr Roche has been absent since the October half-term. I have been given permission to share further information as to the reason for his absence and also to ask for your help if you are able to do so. Mr Roche tripped on the stairs at home and unfortunately the resulting fall damaged his spinal cord in 4 places, leaving him without use of his arms or legs. Things have improved and Mr Roche is now able to control an electric wheelchair and hopefully he should be able to return home soon having been in hospital and then a specialist rehabilitation centre since the accident. However, when he returns home he will only be supplied with a manual wheelchair, which would leave Mr Roche dependent on others, rather than being able to take his daughters to school or the shops. There is also the need for a ramp to be built to the front door so that Mr Roche can get into the house and a stairlift so he can sleep in his own bed again. There is a crowdfunding page to help with the affordability of these items so if you are able to contribute in any way, I know the Roche family and his wider circle of friends and colleagues would be very appreciative. Over the half-term one of the main news stories relating to education was the government's guidance on the use of mobile phones in schools. However, once on site, they must be turned off and put away. The rules for use of phones by Sixth Form students is slightly different but the full guidance can be found in our behaviour policy which is available on the website. Recording and/or distributing material is viewed as a serious incident so please continue to support the school by speaking to your son(s) about this.

Thank you to the parents and carers of Year 9 students for your attendance at and engagement in last night's GCSE Options Evening. I hope you all found the presentations to be clear and informative. Before the deadline of March 7th, you will have the opportunity to speak to subject teachers further about choices and suitability at next Thursday's parents' evening. We also look forward to meeting with parents and carers of Year 13 students on Tuesday evening. Please see Mrs Barlow's correspondence for further information.

Yesterday morning I had the pleasure of welcoming a number of 'Old Boys' into school with the aim of strengthening connections for the benefit of our current students but also to explore methods of bringing the network together. 



DRAMA—Visit from Dr Simpson

Dr Richard Simpson visited the Drama department on Thursday this week to share his experiences of supporting asylum seekers at SERV.

His presentation was well attended. Boys across all age groups asked a wide range of perceptive questions to develop their understanding about the UK asylum seeking system.



We were saddened to learn how long many asylum seekers have to wait for decisions to be made. Boys were also quick to calculate that the weekly allowance for asylum seekers of £49.18 (which is to cover the cost of food, travel, medication and phones etc) was a mere £7.02 per day. Dr Simpson also highlighted discrepancies between statistics relating to the numbers of people applying for asylum in the Uk with how asylum seekers are presented in the media.

His presentation further ignited our passion to share the experiences of asylum seekers with an audience in this years school show, in July.

YEAR 12-UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE

Mr Charnley and Dr Sate took a group of Year 12 physics students to the University of Cambridge to spend the day in the famous Cavendish Laboratory in the Department of Physics. Students took part in a tour of a college at the university, followed by a talk on higher education study and routes into physics. Students then took part in a practical session, investigating gravity in the laboratory and ended the day with a problem-solving challenge. Pupils ex-

celled at this and even won prizes representing Saint Ambrose. Overall, it was an excellent day out and pupils really enjoyed themselves, taking a lot from the experience and representing the college impressively.

ICELAND TRIP



Over half term the Geography Department took 48 students and 5 staff (Mr McFadden, Mr Donnelly, Ms Widolf, Mr Fitzsimon, Ms Dean) to Iceland for 5 days and 4 nights.

On the first day after flying over the recent lava flows from the fissure eruption near to the town of Grindavik, we went to Reykjavik to experience FlyOver Iceland – an immersive Experience about Iceland's culture and natural landscape, before heading to our hotel for an evening meal followed by a swim in the outdoor geothermal swimming pool. We stayed Hotel Ork, in the town of Hveragerði to the East of Reykjavik to reduce travelling times as we explored the East, South and South East of Iceland. We all decided the hotel's facilities were pretty good, with a games room, outdoor geothermal swimming pool, 2 hot tubs and sauna building.

On day 2 we visited the Hellisheidi Power Plant visit (geothermal powerplant) and learned about geothermal energy and carbon capture, before heading to Reykjavik to visit the Perlan Ice Cave and Planetarium, followed by the amazing Lava Show – where we saw lava at 1100°C close up! We then head to a real lava tunnel to go underground and explore the Raufarhólshellir Laval Tunnel.

On day 3, we visited the Ava Centre Exhibition and learned about the Hekla, Katla and Eyjafjallajökull volcanoes, then visited two incredible waterfalls: Skógarfoss (awesome 25m wide and 60m tall waterfall) with incredible views of the landscape around after a long walk-up some icey steps and

Seljalandsfoss (60m tall waterfall). After this we visited the coast from Dyrholaey and then on to a highlight of the trip, the glacier walk on Sólheimajökull. We headed onto the glacier as most tourists were leaving the site and with- Mr McFadden - Trip in an hour had the glacier and valley to ourselves, which was an incredible experience for all. We then visited a local food hall where the boys could choose their own food, before returning to the hotel for our evening swim.

Day 4 was spent on the classic Golden Circle, visiting: Gullfoss waterfall (awesome fault-guided waterfall) where we could walk in its huge gorge, Geysir and Strokkur geysers, the Pingvellir National Park – rifting between American

and Eurasian plates which is a sacred place for Icelandic meetings from the age of the settlers, and on to the Secret Lagoon to relax. We managed to find time to visit the result of an old fissure eruption, resulting in a series of splatter volcanoes at the Kerio Volcanic Crater Lake.

Day 5 was our final day and we visited Reykjavik in the morning to see and experience the culture in the city, before a walking tour and

heading to a fish market and food hall for some excellent fish and chips before heading to the airport.







The boys were excellent ambassadors for the school, with many people remarking on their excellent behaviour and attitude! The trip was an amazing experience, we'd highly recommend Iceland in February and look forward to repeating the trip with the next GCSE cohort.

One of the highlights of the day was an engaging workshop on coding, where the students delved into the intricacies of the cryptographic methods employed during the war. 
Bletchley Park itself is a treasure trove of history, and the boys had the opportunity to explore the various huts and buildings that once


