A Message from the Principal

Additionally, our under 15 water polo team claimed a commendable fifth place in the national cup final held at Eton, while the under 18 water polo team achieved a similar feat in the national plate final at Haberdashers' Aske's Boys' School. As the prestigious Roslyn Park tournament commences, we extend our best wishes for success to all our participating teams.

This week, we had the privilege of welcoming Professor Adam Donne as our guest speaker, offering valuable insights to our aspiring medics. Furthermore, our Science Department organised an enriching trip to the Museum of Science and Industry for our Key Stage 3 pupils, igniting their curiosity and passion for discovery. Even at this stage in the year, new clubs and societies are being launched, with the Aviation Society, which promises to inspire and engage our students with the wonders of flight, the latest to have lift off.


STUDENTS SUCCESS


CHAPLAINCY NEWS

Leading on from our success in the regional round of the Oxford Schools debating competition, held at Manchester Grammar School, Qiyi C and I, Jack E, joined as a team to represent the school at the Oxford Union in the National Finals.

The day began in the chambers of the Union. The atmosphere was inspiring and the label of 'one of the largest student debating competitions in the world' hinted at the breadth of the event, only to be confirmed by the list of schools who were also competing, ranging from Eton College and St Paul's Girls to teams from numerous nations, reaching as far as the Philippines.



In four rounds of debates, we argued topics as diverse as 'parents should not teach children about their own conceptions of the afterlife' to the 'glorification of the career longevity of dominant sports persons'. The day was one of unbelievable access to the 200-year-old Oxford Union (with all its creaky floorboards) and allowed us to walk down the same historic halls as influential figures, including political heads, spiritual leaders and artistic icons.



The day ended with the Grand Final, and while we did not reach this stage, being able to take a step back from our own speaking and witness this culmination of debating was in itself an inspirational moment and one which we will never forget.


