A Message from the Principal

Apologies that there wasn't a newsletter last week. This message combines information relevant to this week whilst also reflecting on the fortnight since the return from Easter. On 22nd April we remembered Stephen Lawrence who was murdered in a racially motivated attack in London in 1993, 31 years ago. His murder led to an investigation that declared the police to be institutionally racist and led to a campaign by his family for Justice for all young people. This declaration was called the **Macpherson Report**. For those of you whose sons study GCSE History, this is a part of the Power and the People course which explores how those from diverse heritage fought for and gained rights in this country. **His mother Doreen was made a Baroness** as recognition of her services for promoting reforms in the police service and setting up the Stephen Lawrence Charitable Trust, in 2013 she spoke of her son's murder.

'Justice for Stephen is about all of us, every one of us, in society having justice. There are still too many young people who do not have a sense of hope, who just don't get the chance to live their dreams. I want all our children and young people to feel inspired, be confident and have hope in their own future. We are building hope but there is more to do.'

We also remembered a local teenager **Ahmed Iqbal Ullah** who was killed in a racially motivated attack in the playground of his school in Burnage in 1986. He is remembered by the Ahmed Ullah Race Relations Centre in the Central Library, Manchester. If you are interested in finding out more, you can visit the centre yourself or visit the website.

To remember Stephen and Ahmed and their legacy, your son could complete some research into their lives and death and produce a poster which calls for justice for all. Please pass or send to Mrs Scott. Some of our students will have heard about Stephen Lawrence and Ahmed Iqbal Ullah in their Thursday Thought.

ROYAL SOCIETY OF CHEMISTRY OLYMPIAD

The annual Royal Society of Chemistry Olympiad took place at the end of January this year and 24 year 13 chemists chose to take part this time. It is a competition open to any student doing A Level Chemistry nationally and it tests knowledge gained during their lessons but applies it to real world scenarios and research. Over 15,000 students took part and all 24 of our students received recognition and prizes for their performance. 11 Students achieved Bronze awards, 12 received Silver and 2 received Gold, George D and Gabriel K. The gold awards are in the top 5% of chemistry students nationally and the silver awards in the top 25%. It is a fantastic achievement for all the students and testament to their hard work over the years and we wish them all the best as they prepare for A Levels and potentially further studies at University within the realms of chemistry. Many thanks also to Dr Berry and Mr Gwyer for preparing the students over the years.


Weekly Prayer Theme for Mass: 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News'

FUNDRAISING CHALLENGE FOR SIERRA LEONE





As you may know, St Ambrose College is privileged to have a

formal twinning relationship with a school in Freetown, Sierra Leone. In 2010, the fundraising efforts of our staff and students allowed for the establishment of the school, which was given the name St Ambrose Academy. Since then, our staff and students have visited the school on numerous occasions as part of our Immersion Programme.

The school was established by the Christian Brothers' West African District in a disused building and the first intake of students was on a very small scale. However, over the years, we have continued to support the Brothers in their work, ensuring that St Ambrose Academy has been able to grow. Our annual Sponsored Walk has traditionally provided the basis of our financial contributions and has allowed us to provide the following support:

- Building of new classroom
- Contribution to teachers' salaries
- Sending of resources and equipment
- Building of toilet blocks for boys and girls
- Digging of a bore hole to provide clean water

Having visited St Ambrose Academy in February 2023 with staff and 6th Form students, we were delighted to learn that the school had recorded the second-best exam results in the entire country and, unsurprisingly, is now oversubscribed. In order to continue this success story and increase the roll call, the Christian Brothers are seeking to build new science classrooms, store rooms and offices. In order to support this project we are dedicating all of our fundraising efforts between now and the end of term to St Ambrose Academy.

We have challenged each Form (except Y11 and 13) to try to raise £1000. That means we're setting a fundraising target of £30,000. Whilst this may seem like a lot, it includes all sponsorship gathered by students for this year's Sponsored Walk on 17th July. In addition, students can organise their own fundraisers in and out of school. The students and Forms who raise the most money will earn rewards at the end of term, so please do encourage your boys to get involved!

Sierra Leone is one of the poorest countries in the world, and education offers hope to millions of young people when they are able to access it. We would appreciate any support you can offer as our school community tries to reach our target
